

Camp Kit List

This kit list is a general guide for you to follow which deciding what to bring to camp. Any additions or changes to the list for a specific camp will be sent out in the camp information letters.

All the kit should be contained within a main rucksack and a day bag. Items should not be attached to the outside of the bags (which makes transportation difficult) and the only things that can be carried separately is a pillow and the uniform.

The uniform should be on a hanger covered with a bin bag with the child's name clearly marked.

Survival bags are available for purchase from the group. Please speak to a leader to find out more.

Generally (weather permitting) we can hand wash and dry clothes during the camp if required, this is another valuable skill the Scout can learn.

Sleep

- Sleeping bag
- Sleeping mat
- Pillow
- Survival bag
- Camp blanket
- Cuddly toy

Clothes

- Nightwear
- Socks
- Walking socks
- Underwear
- Trousers/Shorts
- T-Shirts
- Warm Jumper/Fleece
- Waterproof jacket
- Waterproof trousers
- Sun hat/Cap
- Warm hat/Gloves
- Walking boots
- Trainers

Additional equipment if required

Water activities

- Rash vest/t-shirt
- Water shoes or trainers (no crocs)
- Swimming shorts/costume

Equipment

- Large Bag/Rucksack
- Small backpack
- Torch with spare batteries
- 2 or 3 Black bin liners
- Drinks bottle
- Lunch box
- Toilet roll in plastic bag to keep dry
- Personal first aid kit
- Uniform
- Book/Small game (not electronic)

Wash kit

- Hand towel
- Beach/bath towel
- Sun cream
- Shower gel/Shampoo
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Deodorant
- Brush or comb

It may be worth noting the number of items in the box and then tick them off as you unpack to identify lost items.

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Personal First Aid Kit

The personal first aid kit is a kit of items that the young person may need to treat minor issues or contain medication which the young person is responsible for such as inhalers. Any other medication needs to be handed over to the leaders with the health form.

Example items are.

- Lip balm
- Plasters
- Blister plasters
- Inhaler
- Sun cream
- Antiseptic wipes

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
